The Executive Board of Re-creation, a voluntary agency – Spastic Society of Manipur is pleased to present the Annual Audited Statement of Accounts and the Annual Report for the financial year 2016-2017 which ended on 31st March 2017.

The new Building which is being built as a model Composite Centre for Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities at Tapokpi Bazar , Langthabal Kunja , Canchipur , Imphal West is nearing completion and the centre will be functional from July 2017 . The construction is sponsored by the Govt. of Manipur under Special Central Assistance of the Govt. of India with 10% State's share. It is a dream come true for us as the building is universally designed with all the Accessible norms(Barrier Free Environment) in place for persons with disabilities and the full campus will be eco-friendly .

The building is designed by Architect , Rojen Meetei , Structure Engineer ,Th . Govardhan Singh , Designer R.K. Sanajaoba Singh , Artist W. Robin Singh with Bona Meetei on Multi Media . With this project , we have established a Barrier Free Design Unit of Spastic Society where we will be functioning as Consultant and Access Audit team along with our persons with disabilities members .

Our long wait for the teachers training Programme on B.Ed. Hearing Impairment will be realised by July 2017 with NOC from Government of Manipur and process for Affiliation to Manipur University in progress . With reasonable accommodation and North East Fund from Rehabilitation Council of India , Dept. of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities , Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment , Govt. of India the chances of reimbursement of students fees is very high with laptops for S.C.& S.T. Students .

The event was inaugurated by Mr.A.Kameshwar ,District Social Welfare Officer , Imphal West on 25th April 2016 at Lamyanba Sanglen where more than 10 organisations participated with their beneficiaries . A total of more than 300 persons attended the festival showcasing their talents in vocational skills and displaying finished products .

There was a section on Tailoring and Embroidery where the participants displayed their talent in making mosquito net, shirts and blouses, pillow covers, bed covers, table cloth etc. The participants were from locomotor and hearing impaired group.

There was a section on embroidery where the participants showed their talent in hand embroidery and machine embroidery on handkerchief, shawls, tablecloth etc. Ms Laishram Isheihanbi also showed her talent in foot embroidery.

The mentally retarded students of various special schools showed their talents in arts and craft including flower making, diya painting , candle making etc. Some showed their talents in floral arrangement and making rose using velvet cloth.

The visually impaired student showed their talent in making bags, baskets and flower garlands using plastic wire .some students also made flowers from pieces of cloth and papers and woollen threads .They also displayed finished products made by them and others .They also used different types of adapted tools to make the same.

There was a section on carpentry where the participants were to assemble the base , legs and top of the table .The participants included persons with locomotor impairment and hearing impairment

There was a section on rug doll making and straw doll making where the participants made doll in the form of Radha Krishna, Manipuri bride, and dolls in Manipuri

costume. There was a section on collage making where Mr.Mikal made a painting using cut outs from magazine books and sticking it on a canvas to create a picture of nature showing trees with clouds in the background .

Some participants showed their talent in making articles from cane and bamboo while others showed their talent in crochet and knitting.

All participants were provided with lunch and travel allowance and money was also reimbursed for raw material used to display their talents.

International Day of the Deaf on 25th September 2016 with the theme "With Sign Language I am equal" was celebrated at our centre at Tapokpi Bazaar where the persons with hearing impairment who were part of the construction team of our new centre were felicitated. In our endeavor to provide employment and financial independence to persons



with disabilities we are providing job opportunities in masonry, carpentry, iron works and gardening to them at our newly constructed centre Tapokpi. The purpose of International Week of the Deaf is to draw the attention of legislators, policy makers, and the general public to the achievements of people and the concerns of the Deaf community. During

this week, organizations of deaf people worldwide are encouraged to carry out campaigns to publicize or increase awareness about Deaf culture, language, and legal issues on varying levels. The event increases solidarity among deaf people and their supporters, and is used as a time to stimulate greater efforts to promote the rights of deaf people throughout the world.

World Tourism Day was celebrated on 27th Sept 2016 with the theme Tourism for All

Nearly 6000 persons with hearing impairment all over Manipur were distributed hearing aids with an attempt to enter Guinness book of world record. Honourable Union Minister Shri Gehlot Thawar , and Chief Minister Shri Ibobi Singh were the dignitary of the event with many other officials from the Ministry.

As part of the function Spastic Society of Manipur which is also SNAC, Manipur had organised a stall at the venue to create Awareness of various disability issues by distributing pamplets and poster display of role models include books on schemes of National trust. Mr.Mohanty, Deputy Director of

National Trust was present at the event. Both the Union Minister and Chief Minister attended the stall and encouraged us in our venture.

MARUP (Friends of the disabled persons) an initiative of Spastic Society Of Manipur was part of the Sangai Festival, Manipur



During the Sangai Festival which was celebrated from 20th November 2016 to 30 th November 2016 in Manipur, Spastic Society of Manipur also was alloted two large accessible stall where the persons with disabilities sold, displayed and demonstrated their vocational skills in Cane and Bamboo, Painting and Collage works, Embroidery, Cloth and Rug Dolls, Carpentry and wood carving, flower making and decorations. Spastic Society of Manipur - Special School of C.P and Multiple Disabilities

The special school is continuing with its rehabilitation and educational programmes for children with Multiple disabilities , cerebral palsy , autism , down syndromes and mental retardation using holistic approach providing all remedies under one roof. We have started early intervention programmes for children less than 5 years, home management programme for severe cases and cases from distant places, vocational training programmes for more than 18 years of age.

The children are given training in sports and recreational activities such as dancing, arts and craft, drawing and painting and cultural activities. Every week we have case studies and case conferences with parent meeting and home visits are made by our therapists and social workers for management programmes. Our home management unit takes care of cases of severe degree and those who are from far off places .The children are provided with



home programme for a period of a week and review is done on weekly Our early intervention unit provides all round therapy and rehabilitation to all children with delayed milestones in the age group of 0-6 years.

Our home management unit takes care of cases of severe degree and those who are from places .The children are provided with home programme for a period of a week and review is d

weekly basis . Our early intervention unit provides all round therapy and rehabilitation to all children with delayed milestones in the age group of 0-6 years.

The children are given training in field of arts, craft, yoga , dance and music and sports by experts to provide them with recreation and mould their talents in respective fields.





Special programme for our children with autism is introduced for development of sensory integration and communication skills. Parent and caregiver training programme are introduced for effective follow up at home. Mr. Devananda our Yoga instructor is diligently teaching our children yoga to improve concentration and motor function of the children.

<u>Progress report of Pre-school for hearing handicapped segment for 2016-17</u>

Number of beneficiaries 2016-17: 32 (22 males and 10 females)

Our early intervention unit for hearing handicapped provides audiological evaluation , auditory training ,hearing aid fitting , speech and language therapy and concept development programme along with school readiness programme to children with hearing impairment . It also includes parent training programmes , group therapy and alternative communication approach.





The children are provided with total communication apporach where they are trained in lip reading, finger spelling, auditory training etc after being fitted with hearing aid.
